
SUPPORT POLES (X24)


SETTING UP YOUR GUTTER PROTECTION KIT

GUTTER PROTECTORS

Starting on one end of the gutter, tilt the Gutter Protector 90°, set into the gutter, and rotate into position. If the Protector doesn't rotate into the gutter, slide the Protector left or right to reposition the Collection Cups between the gutter hangers. Repeat this process for additional Gutter Protectors, making sure to overlap the Protectors slightly. Collection Cups can be stacked together to cover a shorter length if needed.






SETTING UP YOUR LANDSCAPE PROTECTION KIT

CHUTE NETS

Before you first setup, screw the pole toppers onto the support poles and attach the included carabiners to the pole toppers. Then start by laying out the Chute Nets on the ground with label facing up next to where you want to install. Attach Custom Banners to the Chute Net in a location where your Custom Banner will be easily seen and lay straight against the house.

Start with one person working between the landscaping and the house and another person handing them the Poles. Beginning at one end of the Chute Net, attach the Carabiner on the support pole to the corner grommet and lift into place. This first Support Pole should lean at approximately a 60° angle away from the center of the Chute Net to keep it from shifting (see illustration). When the Support Pole is in place, push the bottom of the Support Pole into the ground to prevent slipping. Extend the Support Pole to desired height, lean against the house, and lock the latch into place.



CHUTE NETS (CONT.)

Working your way along, attach additional Support Poles to the Chute Net and lean against the house. For best allocation of Support Poles, skip every other Grommet and use eight (8) Support Poles per net. Additional Support Poles and Pole/Grommet variations can be used for increased versatility. To provide lateral support for the Chute Net, the two outer Support Poles should continue to lean away from the center of the Net (see illustration).




GROUND NETS

Lay out Ground Nets label-side down. These are designed for heavy loads, so make sure to place them only over solid surfaces like grass or concrete. Focusing on high traffic areas where the majority of debris will collect, lay out the ground nets at the base of the Chute Nets with about one foot of overlap between each net. Make sure to place the bottom edge of the Chute Nets on top of the Ground Nets.



LANDSCAPE NETS

Lay out the Landscape Nets over any uncovered areas or low-impact areas like gable ends.



TAKING DOWN YOUR CATCH-ALL

- Unlock Support Pole latch, lower and close latch. Unclip Chute Net from Carabiner and fold Chute Nets.
 Travel with Support Poles & Pole
 Toppers protected.
- Start by rotating the Gutter
 Protectors up and out of the gutter
 and emptying them onto the
 Ground Nets. Stack together for
 easy travel.
- Using the reinforced handles around the edge of the Ground Nets, fold debris into the middle, carry and empty debris into your dump trailer. (Do not drag ground nets.)
- 2 Shake any left over debris off of the Chute Nets onto the Ground Nets.
- Transport and store The Catch-All in a dry place.
- Detach Custom Banners from
 Chute Nets roll Custom Banners to
 protect against creasing.

WHAT NOT TO DO

WHAT	DO	DO NOT
ACCUMULATION OF DEBRIS	Clean off Chute Nets of weight more than a few pounds	Let weight pile up on Chute Nets
CARRYING	Use Carry Handles to keep net off ground during cleanup	Drag nets
TRAVEL & STORAGE	Do close poles to their shortest length before travel and storage	Pile heavy weight on top of poles or pole toppers

WARNINGS

SUPPORT POLES

** DANGER **

- · Do not use the Catch-All or its Support Poles around electrical wires, equipment, or utility wiring
- · Maintain a distance of at least 10 feet from power lines [OHSA 29 CFR 1926.1408]
- Support Poles are not weight bearing and not rated for any use in supporting any object other than Catch-All Chute Nets
- · Serious injury or death may occur from improper use

NETS AND CARABINERS

** WARNING **

- · Do not use net for anything but catching roofing debris
- · Net will not support the weight of any person in any configuration
- When installing and using the Nets, make sure that the Nets are clear of the feet of any ladder being used. Failure to do so will result in a fall hazard.
- The Carabiners supplied with the net system are not rated for climbing, lifting, or life-safety and should only be used to hold the Nets in place
- The Carabiners are only designed to hold the Nets in place and are subject to failure if used for any other load-bearing purpose
- · Insure that no people, including your personnel, or pets are allowed on the Nets while in use
- The Chute, Ground, and Landscape Nets, when used properly, dramatically reduce cleanup for roofing debris, but do not guarantee 100% debris capture. Adequate inspection following use for stray nails and debris is required
- Chute, Ground, and Landscape Nets may obscure potential hazards including, but not limited to, slip, trip, and fall risks. Inspect the site before deploying the Nets, visibly mark any such hazards, and discuss with your crew before commencing work

GUTTER PROTECTION

** WARNING **

- · Follow all warnings and instructions on your ladder when installing, removing or using the inserts
- Make sure that the gutter is in good condition and securely attached to the house prior to attaching the Gutter Protection.
- · Make sure that each section of Protection is securely in place before resting a ladder on it
- · Do not attempt to move a section of Protector if a ladder is contacting it
- · Do not move the ladder if any person is on the ladder
- · Do not use any section of Protector which has been damaged
- Gutter Inserts do not provide any additional strength or support to gutters do not place heavy objects in the Gutter Protectors or use the Gutter Protectors to support your body. Do not stand on the gutters even when the Protectors are in place
- · Serious injury or death may occur from improper use
